

What is Temperament??




A person's nature ,especially as it permanently affects their behaviour.

The word temperament originated from Latin word 'temperare' which means to temper, restrain, a mixture or balance of contrary qualities; an innate or acquired disposition.

Characteristic combination of bodily, mental, and moral qualities, which together constitute the character and disposition of an individual and predispose him to act and behave in a particular manner- Webster Universal Dictionary






















Temperament is the characteristic combination of bodily, mental and moral qualities which together constitute the character and disposition of an individual and predispose him to act and behave in a particular manner.






EVOLUTION OF TEMPERAMENTS

HIPPOCRATES' HUMORISM

Hippocrates (400 B.C.) believed that body is composed of Four Humors viz Blood, Phlegm, Yellow bile and Black bile.

The Imbalance of Humors, or *Dyscrasia* was thought to be the Cause of all **Diseases**.



GALEN'S TEMPERAMENT

Galen (130-200 AD) used the term to refer to Bodily dispositions, which determined a person's susceptibility to particular diseases as well as behavioral and emotional inclinations.



While the Humors literally represented fluids thought to circulate in the body, metaphorically each became associated with a prevailing emotion:

- Blood with joy, called the Sanguine temperament
- Phlegm with worry and contemplative calm, the Phlegmatic temperament.
- * Yellow bile with anger, called the *Choleric* temperament.
- Black bile with sadness, called the *Melancholic* temperament













- ✓ They are our patterns of behaviourthe way we usually respond to situations.
- ✓ It is also defined as a persons nature ,ones usual way of thinking or acting.
- ✓ The physical data can be easily elicited, but problem arises in understanding the mental makeup of the patient.
- ✓ Knowledge of temperaments can be used as a tool to understand the mentals better.

According to psychologists, the innate aspects of an individuals personality such as introversion or extroversion is termed as temperament.

They are instinctive natural behaviours, rather than learned behaviours.

- Temperament is our inborn, God given nature.
- Temperament remains constant throughout our life.
- Temperament is different from personality
- Personality is something which can be changed, developed or enhanced.
- It is this aspect of Personality concerned with emotional dispositions and Reactions.
- No temperament type is good or bad. Each temperament has its own set of strength and weakness.
 With the similimum the weakness can be diminished.
